Course Description:

This course focuses on mastery of the PA Academic Standards for Arts and Humanities. Students in 6th grade will explore both 2 dimensional and 3 dimensional methods of art creation. They will build on their knowledge of drawing and 2 dimensional design and composition, and they will begin to explore clay construction. Technology will be incorporated through the introduction of Adobe Photo shop and the understanding of the program's basic functions.
