This course focuses on mastery of the PA Academic Standards for Arts and the Humanities. The purpose of music theory is to make students fully aware of the factors that govern musical interpretation and to deepen their awareness, understanding and appreciation for the elements that make up a piece of music. Students not only study, but learn how to interpret/analyze on the intuitive level what a composer actually meant by their writings. Students will develop the terminology and skills needed to analyze and compose music. This class is offered to sophomores, juniors and seniors.
