## **Course Description:**

This course focuses on mastery of the PA Academic Standards for Arts and Humanities. During the course, the chorus learns to sing four to eight part music, which is performed in the annual winter concert, the MIOSM (Music in Our Schools Month) concert and the Spring Arts Festival concert. Breathing, vocal range extension, sight singing and vocal health exercises are a part of the program. Responsibility, organization, self-discipline, respect and commitment are major components of the overall philosophy of the group. This course is a yearlong commitment.
