Academic Presentation: Digital Conversion – Mrs. Carrie Recla, along with 6 of her students, did a mock lesson with their iPads. Mrs. Recla showed the Board how students use the ebackpack, educreation, and socrative apps to do different things in her class from answering bell ringers, turning in homework, taking a short quiz, etc.

**School Performance Profile (SPP)**: Mr. Heintzelman, Mr. Groshek, and Mr. Sharrow shared with the Board their buildings SPP scores and how their scores were calculated. The elementary school score is 82.80%, the middle school score is 73.4%, and the high school score is 79.9%.
